

MEDICARE DIABETES PREVENTION PROGRAM (MDPP) RESOURCE SHEET

The [Medicare Diabetes Prevention Program](#) (MDPP) expanded model includes an evidence-based set of services, CDC's [National Diabetes Prevention Program](#), to help prevent type 2 diabetes in individuals with an indication of prediabetes. MDPP is available to eligible Medicare beneficiaries nationwide beginning April 1, 2018 under a performance-based payment model through the CMS Innovation Center.

National Diabetes Prevention Program suppliers who hold preliminary or full recognition status with CDC's [Diabetes Prevention Recognition Program](#) may enroll as MDPP suppliers. Below is a list of resources to help inform the enrollment process.

IMPORTANT MEDICARE DPP DATES

- January 1, 2018:** Enrollment began for eligible suppliers
April 1, 2018: Medicare reimbursement began for eligible beneficiaries
July 2018: First MDPP sites listed on [supplier map](#).
